










The Resident of Negri Sembilan in his annual report states that the last few months of 1916 were marked by an incursion of man-eating tigers into the area between the Jimah and the Sepang rivers, which, it has been suggested, was due to the opening up of lands at Banting and Morib on the Selangor side of the Sepang river, compelling the tigers lurking there to move southward. Three were shot—two by Mr. Hay, of Klang, and one by a Malay at Tanah Merah. The number of deaths from this cause reported as occurring in the district was 17.
